



AHSAA SPIRIT AWARD SELECTION CRITERIA

The AHSAA Spirit Award is a \$1,000 scholarship that will be presented annually to a senior student who displays a well-rounded background in academics, extra-curricular activities and pride in being a Colonist. Candidates must plan to continue education in college or a vocational program at any accredited institution.

After submitting an application (see reverse side), two letters of recommendation and a biographical sketch that includes goals, interests, activities and accomplishments, an AHSAA Scholarship Committee will review all applications, then invite candidates to a panel-style interview.

Candidates will be asked to provide a 2-minute introduction about themselves and be prepared to answer the following questions:

1. How do you plan to give back to your community after you graduate and become successful?
2. What was your best experience as an Anaheim High student and why?
3. Why do you deserve this scholarship?

The panel members may also ask individual questions. Panel members will base their final selection on the candidate's written materials, as well as the individual interview, looking at such criteria as poise, professional attire and evidence of intelligence and maturity.

The check for the AHSAA Spirit Award will be made payable to the school the student will be attending or to the student directly upon receipt of proof of registration.
